

Theme Learning



Our Theme for this half-term is *'where does our food come from?'* As scientists, the children have already learnt about the different parts of plants and what they do, such as the stem and petals. As geographers, they have explored fruits and vegetables from all over the world and identified the continents they come from. As readers and writers, the children will read the Charlie and Lola story called 'I will not ever, never eat a tomato,' learning how to perform it with Talk for Writing before using that to help them write the story themselves.
